We note that a statement was not taken from the person who allegedly had his foot run over by the excavator as he did not notify John Holland of the incident.  Based on this investigation, the following outcomes have been implemented:  - The Traffic Control Plan (TCP) has been reviewed and minor improvements have been proposed.  - The amended TCP provides clear isolation between parties (in the instance of community members and plant).  - Barriers will be procured to facilitate the amended TCPs isolation protocol.  The investigation concluded, from winess accounts, that the community members alleged injury could not be verified, as:  - The alleged injury was not notified to any person(s).  - The person did not seek assistance from the Police.  - The person did not seek assistance from the Police.  - First aid was available – yet not requested.
